Book Club

April Meeting Recap

On Tuesday, April 30, eight members of the book club met to discuss the popular selection *Killers* of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI by David Grann. With the timely release of Scorcese's film a few months ago, we found much to discuss, including Grann's storytelling. Similar to Erik Larson, he injects so much humanity into the facts and figures of



history, and his extensive research weaves a dark corner of American history straight into the light. We were dismayed, if not shocked, to not have encountered the Osage and their brief moment in time as the richest population in the world per capita in our history classes. We covered each player's motivations and trajectory, the evolution of law enforcement tactics, and how justice is portrayed in the book. Last year we read Grann's *The Wager* and felt, similar to *Flower Moon*, that the rich details of systemic control, violence, and survival seemed impossibly nefarious and harsh. Kudos to Grann, then, for exposing such greed and accomplishing his stated intent, "acknowledging the original sin that comes with the formation of our country."

They include replicas of Holy Land Shrines, over 1,000 roses, beautiful azaleas, and numerous perennials and annuals on the 42 acre site. Also on the property are some of the best architectural designs by noted architectural sculptor, John J. Earley, who also designed Meridian Hill Park in Washington, DC.


The garden tour includes the upper gardens, the lower gardens, and a trip with a guide to the areas behind the Monastery. These include a 100 year old greenhouse used by the Franciscan Monastery Garden Guild, a cemetery still in use for burial of friars, bee hives for collection of honey, a barn from the original McCeney property, a working farm run by the Garden Guild, and other shrines.



We will meet at the entrance gate of the portico just across 14th Street. Free parking is available onsite at the corner of 14th and Quincy Street. Registration required, and capacity is capped at 25. Member ticket price is \$3. Reserve your spot here!
