
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I. Book Club

July Meeting Recap

On Monday, July 29, seven members of the book club met to discuss the eclectic nonfiction selection of essays *The Anthropocene Reviewed* by John Green. The group was a delightful mix of readers deeply versed in Green's prior works, and others with no prior exposure to his writing, which made for a fascinating chat on the merits of our July pick. In *Anthropocene*, Green reflects on a range of topics in the human experience, both broad (our capacity for wonder), and narrow (diet Dr Pepper). While some members wished the book's tone was more academic, and others simply didn't find resonance with Green's personal anecdotes, we appreciated his effort to grapple with the singular unmoored and contemplative mood many found starting in 2020 amidst lockdowns and a relentless news cycle.

Lindsay Wright is a mission driven, bilingual, strategic management professional. She is currently the Managing Director of Strategy Management at the Flamboyan Foundation, a family foundation working in Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico to build a world where all children have the opportunity to live a fulfilling life by making strategic investments in public education, arts, and culture. Lindsay is a 2016 PBK alumna of James Madison University, where she double majored in Communication Studies and Modern Foreign Languages with concentrations in Cultural Communications and Spanish, respectively. Lindsay began her career in the non-profit sector at NewBridges Immigrant Resource Center and the Children's Defense Fund. She splits her time between Washington, D.C. and San Juan, Puerto Rico and loves to travel elsewhere around the world in her free time.

Her talk will be about strategic approaches in philanthropy to generate systemic change, focusing on Flamboyan's work with DC Public Schools and the multisectorial coalition *Todos a Leer* in Puerto Rico.

Our next annual event is already around the corner! Join us at this year's <u>Key Connections</u> <u>MentorMix Event</u> **Sunday, September 29 11:00AM-2:00PM at the Workhouse Arts Center**. As



always, Key Connections will support Phi Betes helping Phi Betes through networking at all career stages – from brand new inductees to veteran members. This year's event will be hosted on the picturesque campus of one of the most eclectic art galleries in the area, where guests will be surrounded by pieces from preeminent artists in a wide variety of media: painting, ceramics, glasswork, sculpture, textiles, and more...but that's not all!

For fans of dark history, the beautiful red brick architecture in the style of Thomas Jefferson belies, by design, the true purpose for which the structures were built. Originally a penitentiary under the DC prison system, the workhouse was notoriously a place for would-be prisoners to work off their debt to society as an alternative to formal imprisonment. None other than the suffragettes were detained within these walls before they were sent off to their permanent prison quarters, and the grounds contain a small museum dedicated to the women's suffrage movement. Not until the early 2000s was the workhouse repurposed from a functioning prison to an arts gallery, as careful observers can glean from the guard's watchtower on the lawn, still viewable from the main building.

This year's event will be a mashup of the annual Key Connections event with our MentorMix events offered through the <u>Mentorship Network</u>.


